Keep Your Pet Healthy

Understand what the most common poisons are to your pet. Knowing common poisons helps you stay mindful of what's around your pet and what to remove from their reach.

The top poisons for pets include:

- Over the counter and prescription medications
- Grapes
- Raisins
- Chocolate
- Onions
- Pennies
- Lilies
- Sago palms
- Azaleas
- Rhododendrons
- Daffodils

Learn the signs of poisoning. Common symptoms your pet may show include:

- Drooling
- Vomiting
- Loss of appetite
- Diarrhea
- Lethargy, weakness
- Pale or yellowish gums
- Coughing of blood
- Excessive thirst or urination

Seek help right away. If you suspect your pet is experiencing poisoning, contact your veterinarian or emergency veterinarian if after hours. You can also call the pet poison hotline at 1-800-213-6680.
